

The CAP Chaplain College is Three Years Old

In the summer of 2021, the Civil Air Patrol Chaplain Corps College offered its first online course with a vision to create a common core of education and training for the Chaplain and Character Development Instructor specialty tracks. This was the first “Wing Chaplain Course.” The Chaplain Support Team (CST) was already on the minds of the corps’ leadership. Having both special tracks train together for billets at the wing level made sense. This was especially important since within a year, the new version of the corps’ governing regulation, CAP Regulation 80-1, codified the position of Wing Administrator for all wings without a chaplain. The newly named CAP Pamphlet 40-80 which articulated the requirements for specialty track training called for the Wing Chaplain Course and an Advanced Character Development Course to be mandatory for everyone. What was first only a vision in 2020 was now tasked with moving forward with its mandate to prepare everyone who wanted to excel in their positions as a CAP chaplain and CDI.

From these humble beginnings, the college has expanded its offerings to include courses to support the specialty tracks from the newest member to the most senior member of the corps. The college program currently offers five courses to do that. These include the following courses:

1. First is a newly created “Squadron Chaplain/CDI Course” for Technician ratings. The first offering of the course just concluded in September 2024. This course is not yet codified in the training plan, but it will be thoroughly evaluated as a future requirement soon.
2. The “Wing Chaplain Course” is now required for Senior ratings and is currently supporting its seventh cohort during the month of November.
3. A new “Region Chaplain Course” was first offered this past summer and will also be evaluated as a possible future requirement.
4. The “Advanced Character Development Course” which is required for Master ratings has just concluded its sixth offering since the first in the Spring of 2022.
5. A future “Flight Chaplain Course” is preparing to launch in the Spring of 2025.

While the professional education program was the first to start at the college, within a few months, a team of former military officers initiated and taught the first of four component classes of the Auxiliary Chaplain Course (AUX). This program prepares CAP chaplains with and without prior military service to support the Department of Defense components and the Department of Veterans Affairs in auxiliary backfill and augmentation roles. The program brings CAP chaplains in direct contact with USAF active-duty chaplains and students in the Air Force Chaplain Corps College at Maxwell AFB. CAP chaplains spend a week at Maxwell and train with students at the AFCCC’s Basic Chaplain Course.
